Subject: Changes on Jedburgh Road

Jedburgh and Duplex Become ActiveTO Quiet Streets

As some of you may have noticed when you were out and about today, there has been a change on Jedburgh Road and Duplex Avenue.

The office of Mike Colle has advised the following:

The three km north-south route along Duplex Avenue/Jedburgh Road from Montgomery Avenue to Brooke Avenue has been designated a Quiet Street as part of the ActiveTO program. The Quiet Streets program will continue until indicated by the City.

Quiet Streets are shared space for drivers, pedestrians and cyclists. Signs and temporary barricades are placed at intersections to encourage slow, local vehicle access only. The reduced traffic levels increase capacity for cyclists and

pedestrians to help make sure people have space to get around while respecting physical distancing.

Speed limit changes are not currently being undertaken as part of the Quiet Streets program. It is currently an advisory-only program that relies on voluntary compliance.

As City of Toronto staff consider and monitor the Quiet Streets program, they have advised that they will use lessons learned over the past month, as well as suggestions and comments from the public, to guide any changes that need to be made to the Quiet Streets program going forward.
